This form will be considered by assessors in their evaluation of the application. Digitally completed forms are preferred. If typing, do not overfill text box (text must be legible). For this program, an **artist** is considered **professional** if they:

- Are recognized as professional by other practitioners working in similar artistic practice and are committed to working full-time at their practice when financially possible.
- Have completed appropriate and relevant training that has prepared them to work in their field of practice. Training may be through post-secondary institutions, apprenticeship or traditional knowledge transfer or apprenticeship with a with a qualified practitioner.
- Have a minimum two years of professional practice in their field following basic training.
- · Have a demonstrated body of previous work for which they have received payment aligned with industry standards, or
- Have received at least one grant to assist with the creation of work through the First People's Cultural Council's Individual Artists Program or Indigenous Arts Programs.
